Class Offerings

K- 1st Grade (Lower Grades)

Dance Me a Story

Dance is one of the most expressive and exciting ways to tell a story. The students in this class will use stories to inspire movement. Blending the elements of plot, music, characters, and physical movement, students in this class will integrate their learning into a spectacular visual story. Watch them skip, bop, and shimmy their way from “Once Upon a Time” to “Happily Ever After”!

Mondays 3:00 - 4:00pm - Sept 21 - Nov 16

Mini Musical

Performers will learn what it takes to put together a show from start to finish, complete with acting, singing and dancing. As an ensemble students will practice choreography, learn lyrics, and rehearse scenes, working together to build a musical performance! For those who are interested in learning more about musical theatre, this class will cover everything an actor needs to know to become Broadway bound!

Recycled Art

Students will be inspired to find art all around them in this multi media visual arts class. Using recycled materials and found household objects, combined with common art supplies, students will explore ways to reuse, and reinvent with creativity. Projects will explore Drawing, Painting, Collage, Printing & Sculpture. Students will learn about art concepts such as color theory, composition and balance while being introduced to notable artists and their works. Join Recycled Art and celebrate creating something extraordinary out of the ordinary.

Myths & Legends

Storytellers in this class will bring Myths & Legends from around the world to life! In this class, students will use skills in literacy, teamwork, and creative thinking to devise staged versions of familiar stories. Students will draw inspiration from different places such as Native American folktales, or the myths from Ancient Greece! Students will use acting techniques and their curious imaginations to stage an adaptation of a timeless story!

Lego Artists

In this class, students experience the excitement of Lego and learning! This class will introduce teamwork, observation, creative thinking, and problem-solving skills while students use their imaginations to build artistic Lego creations! Students will learn about famous pieces of art and architecture, explore 2D mosaics, and build upwards in 3D. Students will be able to build individually and in groups, giving them a sense of ensemble and how their pieces and fun ideas fit into the whole.

Class Offerings

2nd-5th Grade (Upper Grades)

Hip Hop

With a focus on combining old and new hip hop moves and styles, dancers will learn all about this athletically staccato dance form. Students will pop, lock, jam, and break while also working together to create dynamic dance pieces. Balancing challenging choreography with the students' own creative influence, this class will result in an exciting dance performance.

Star Performers

Through the exploration of song and dance, students will become Star Performers! From Ariana Grande to Justin Timberlake, performers will learn to sing and dance like these amazing pop stars. Each week students will work on the vocal techniques, choreography, and personal style it takes to become a super star. At the end of the semester, the Star Performers will dazzle in a pop concert performance!

Tuesdays 3:00 - 4:00pm - Sept 22 - Nov 17

Graphic Novels

In this advanced cartooning class, students will learn to create characters, worlds, and stories using the art of illustration. With a balance of literacy, storytelling, and visual art, the Graphic Novelists from this class will jump head first into the world of cartooning. They will have the opportunity to develop new characters, as well as place their favorite comics in new settings. At the end of the class, students will walk away with their own graphic novel!

Wednesdays 3:00 - 4:00pm - Sept 23 - Nov 18

Acting & Improv

Students will learn the skills of Acting and Improvisation in this hands-on, spontaneous theatre class. Actors will learn the basic rules of improv to develop and hone their skills as performers. They will learn the foundations of improv such as "Yes, and..." and "roll with it" through their exploration of acting techniques, games, and exercises. Students will create exciting characters, conflicts, and stories by using their voices, bodies, and imaginations. The class will culminate in an improv performance for all to enjoy!

Thursdays 3:00 - 4:00pm - Sept 24 - Nov 19

Yoga

Breathe deeply. Meditate. Stretch. Move! Through the ancient art of yoga, students will gain flexibility and have the freedom to dance and explore creative movement. These yoga sessions will combine reflection, light stretching, breathing, various yoga poses, and meditation. By the end of the semester, students will feel peaceful and ready to share all they've learned in a yoga demonstration. Namaste.
